## ***Fatigue in Clinical Populations: Do We Really Know What We Think We Know?***

Vice President for Research and Training at Kessler Foundation Research Center

Fatigue is among the most frequent symptoms observed among neurological and other medical populations. It is also one of the most misunderstood and difficult to access symptoms. This talk will provide an overview of our current conceptualization of fatigue, beginning with its history and definition, its assessment and measurement, and the nature of fatigue in the general population, followed by a detailed discussion of fatigue in various clinical populations. The discussion will continue with putative brain mechanisms involved with fatigue and continue with what is known about the treatment of fatigue.
